# Mauchline Burns Club


N 8th February, 1923, a company of sixteen gentlemen met in the Lesser Temperance Hall for the purpose of forming a Burns Club. The meeting was called by and presided over by the late James MacIntyre. In his remarks, Mr. MacIntyre pointed out that Robert Burns had written much of his best work while resident in the parish of Mauchline, and, in view of that, he felt that Mauchline should have a Burns Club which would study the works of the poet as well as foster and encourage a love of his poems and songs. The meeting unanimously decided to form a club and that it should be called the Mauchline Burns Club. The first President was the late Mr. John Taylor Gibb, the Mauchline historian.

Since that time the chair of Mauchline Burns Club has been held by many well-known and respected members of the community. Men like the late Mr. James Dunlop, who was also the Club Secretary for over twenty years. Another notable President was the late Mr. J. Kevan McDowall, the prominent Glasgow lawyer, who, as Vice-President, was invited to become President in 1940 on the death of the President, Mr. Stephen Cosh. Mr. McDowall remained in office until 1946. During these war years he failed to attend only two meetings, both times due to illness, in spite of having to travel from Glasgow in all kinds of weather during the blackout.

A notable feature of the Club meetings—and it should be pointed out that the Club meets twice a month from October to April—is the high standard of talks given to members. These talks cover every aspect of the Scottish scene, and a recent innovation has been the annual lecture on one of the industries which plays a big part in the economy of the country. In recent years, the industries thus covered have included coal, wool, and cotton.

The highlight of each session is, of course, the Annual Celebration which is held in Poosie Nansie's on 25th January. The first two dinners held by the Club in 1924 and again in 1925 were both broadcast—the first time such a thing had been done. The Club has been fortunate in having speakers of note at these gatherings, and, this year, the Bi-centenary of the Poet's Birth, we were indeed honoured by having as our principal guest Dr. David Daiches, the well-known authority on Burns. On this occasion, the toast list bore the names of five Past Presidents and at least two of the founder members were present.

The members are proud of the Club's record, which has more than justified the enthusiasm of the small band who met in the Lesser Temperance Hall over thirty-six years ago.



# Mauchline Old Churchyard

AUCHLINE Old Churchyard has a special attraction for Burns lovers as it marks the last resting place of several of the poet's contemporaries and its immediate surroundings are rich in Burns associations. Every year brings to Mauchline visitors from all parts of the world and the Old Churchyard is to them an object of the deepest interest, because the place has been consecrated by the genius of the National Poet of Scotland. Burns worshipped in the Old Church and it was in the Old Church and the present Churchyard that he witnessed those scenes of mingled solemnity and profanation that have been so well described in his communion satire. Kirk Session records inform us that in 1779 "by reason of the school kept in the Church, by reason of many doors opening upon the Churchvard and ready access to it from all quarters, it is altogether a thoroughfare and a place of rendezvous for all sorts of idle and disorderly persons" and "that the Churchyard is now become a sort of dunghill and common office-house for all filthiness so that one can scarce walk to church with clean feet". Apart from the fact that the Churchyard was the school children's playground, we must remember that before the surrounding wall was built, cattle often straved and grazed in the Kirkyard. The deplorable condition of the Churchyard must have continued for many years because it was in 1750 that Rev. Mr. Auld commenced his fight for Churchvard purity. Since then, the situation has gradually improved, and to-day the Churchyard is carefully supervised and well kept by an officer in almost daily attendance.

The expense of this care and attention is a constant drain on the funds of the Church, and townspeople are apt to forget that as the Old Churchyard was the Parish Burial Ground, its preservation and upkeep should be the concern of the entire community.

The graves of Burns's contemporaries may be easily found by following the numbered markers shown on the plan erected near the Churchyard gate. A copy of the plan is also shown on facing page.

# Ballochmyle Hospital

PALLOCHMYLE House was taken over at the beginning of the last war for use as an Emergency Medical Service Hospital.

By early 1940 wards had been built in the grounds, and by 1942 a total of thirty-three wards had been completed and staff accommodation provided.

Initially, mainly service personnel were treated. Besides British service men and women, Free-French and Polish troops and others received treatment.

June, 1944, saw the return of the invasion casualties.

A large number of P.O.W.'s were admitted from the local camps at Kingencleugh and Pennylands, chiefly Italians and Germans.

By 1945 the number of inpatients had been increased to about 1,000 by the arrival from London of elderly patients transferred from the flying-bomb areas.

This was the peak period for numbers, and after hostilities ceased Ballochmyle Hospital gradually assumed its present civilian role.

5th July, 1948, saw the introduction of the National Health Service, and Ballochmyle Hospital was retained to serve the needs of this area.

At present, some fifteen wards are in use for inpatients and the number of occupied beds being about 300. Outpatient attendances number approximately 37,000 per annum. Some 5,000 new patients attend every year.

The wards treat surgical, medical, plastic (including faciomaxillary and dental), gynæcological, urological, ear, nose and throat, eye and geriatric patients.

Outpatient clinics deal with these specialties as well as psychiatry, diseases of the skin and diseases of the chest.

Ancillary services are provided by the laboratory, the physiotherapy, electrocardiographic and X-ray departments.

The medical staff consists of some forty doctors, from house officers to consultants. Most of the senior members, however, also attend other hospitals in the area.

There is a nursing staff of 200, and another 200 people work in the hospital in one capacity or another.

Ballochmyle House is now used as a staff residence. It was, of course, at one time the home of Miss Wilhelmina Alexander to whom Burns dedicated "The Lass of Ballochmyle."

#### COAL MINING IN THE MAUCHLINE DISTRICT.

Although it is recorded that coal was worked near Mauchline as long ago as the late fifteenth century—near Tarbolton—there was no coal mining in the district between the middle of the nineteenth century and the commencement of the development of Mauchline Colliery in the 1930's.

Lochlea Colliery, sunk in 1949, and Sorn Colliery, sunk in 1952, are now working the same coals as Mauchline Colliery. It is interesting to note that Lochlea Colliery workings are under the fields of Lochlea Farm which was farmed at one time by the Burns family and where Robert Burns lived and worked for a period.

These three collieries are all situated on the northern fringe of an extensive coal-bearing area known as the Mauehline Basin, in the southern part of which is sunk Killoch Colliery, a large modern coal mine designed to produce a substantial output. Coal production from Killoch will start in 1960.




